Based on the project applicant's analysis, there appear to be no significant impacts from the Falmouth Technology Park wind turbine proposal. Furthermore, the project will generate a reliable source of clean energy. The applicant's feasibility study states that the proposed turbine will replace fossil fuel energy requirements that would generate 1,029 tons of carbon dioxide, 3,253 pounds of sulfur dioxide and 1,000 pounds of nitrous oxide per year.

APCC understands that any electricity generated by the wind turbine that is not used by the project applicant will go into the NSTAR grid. APCC supports this proposed scenario.

APCC is a strong advocate of Cape Cod towns adopting wind energy and other clean energy sources for municipal uses. If the proposed privately operated Notus Clean Energy LLC wind turbine is permitted, APCC hopes it will inspire the town of Falmouth to actively pursue its own municipal wind energy projects in appropriate locations.

APCC thanks the Falmouth Zoning Board of Appeals for this opportunity to comment.
